Join us for the Community Archiving Workshop at Fisk University! This event brings volunteers from the community together with audiovisual archivists from the Southeast to learn the essentials of archiving analog audiovisual materials and to gain hands-on experience by working with collection from the Fisk University Library Special Collections and Archives.

The workshop will begin with an introduction to the Fisk University Franklin Library Special Collections and Archives and training in essential AV archiving practices by audiovisual archivists. In the afternoon, we will apply what we have learned by working hands-on with collection materials. A mini workshop in film inspection will also be provided in the afternoon. Lunch is provided. This is a free event. No prior experience with audiovisual materials or archival collections is necessary - we welcome all community members, from library professionals to volunteers.

This day-long event is in partnership with the Community Archiving Workshop, Metro Nashville Archives' Audiovisual Heritage Center, and Appalshop. This project is part of the National Community Archiving Workshop Training of Trainers Program supported by the Institute for Museum and Library Services (IMLS). From 2018-2020, archivists and communities around the country are gathering to share resources and preserve and provide access to endangered audiovisual heritage collections.
