I, Adelia Cheatham, domiciled in the County of Davidson, State of Tennessee, knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, by virtue of a power retained by me in a marriage settlement entered into by me and my husband, Dr. William A. Cheatham, do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made by me.

My domicil is now and has been for many years in the State of Tennessee, where I own real and personal or movable property.

Item 1st. It is my wish and desire that all just debts against me shall be paid.

Item 2nd. My two sons, Joseph H. and William H. Acklen, inherited a large estate from their deceased half-sister, my daughter Emma Franklin, my son Claude and my daughter Pauline being born after the death of said Emma.

Item 3rd. I hereby give and bequeath in trust to my daughter Pauline, all the stock that I hold, amounting to fourteen or fifteen thousand dollars, in the Nashville Cotton Factory, known as the Tennessee Manufacturing Co., together with all dividends that may accrue or be collected on the same, for her sole and separate use and benefit, free from the use or control of any husband she may marry.
